Anti-social Behaviour



Our community standard

We expect all residents to respect their neighbours and neighbourhoods. Anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated.



Understanding Anti-social Behaviour

Behaviour that causes or is likely to cause alarm, harassment, or distress to one or more persons not of the same household.





Your responsibilities

- Show respect and tolerance for neighbours
- Follow the obligations outlined in your tenancy agreement
- Report incidents promptly and appropriately

Vandalism



Protecting our community

Vandalism endangers public safety and damages the appearance of our neighbourhoods.

Serious consequences

Tenants or their visitors found responsible for vandalism will face:

- Direct action from the council
- Police involvement
- Possible eviction proceedings



Your role



Report vandalism promptly



Discourage destructive behaviour



Help maintain our shared spaces



Quick reporting helps us address vandalism before it spreads and becomes more difficult to manage.

Harassment



Understanding harassment

Harassment is targeted anti-social behaviour directed at individuals, families, or groups that interferes with quality of life.

IMPORTANT!
For your safety, never
directly confront
those responsible for
harassment.

Common forms include:

- Violence or threats (including weapon possession)
- Using dogs as weapons or threats
- Abusive or insulting words/behaviour
- Property damage or threats of damage
- Racist behaviour (verbal/written abuse, vandalism, malicious calls)
- Deliberately creating excessive noise to annoy neighbours



Reporting incidents

Contact your housing officer for all incidents. In emergencies, call the police immediately. When possible, document incidents with dates, times, and descriptions to help establish patterns of behaviour.



We take all reports of harassment seriously and will work with you and appropriate authorities to address the situation.

Domestic Abuse



Understanding Domestic Abuse

Domestic abuse is any incident or pattern of controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse. It takes many forms including psychological, physical, sexual, financial, and emotional abuse. Victims are not confined to one gender or ethnic group.
